

This training will:

- Review some of the basic professional goals that law enforcement and other community stakeholders have in the performance of their duties;
- Talk about the relationship these stakeholders have to one another as well as the overlapping goals they share and possibilities for collaboration;
- Explore how law enforcement is trained to respond to calls for service;
- Analyze how officers are trained to interact with the public, and investigate crimes;
- Look at the power of knowledge, as well as the fact that we know what we know, but we don't know what we don't know; and
- Devise ways in which the existing base of knowledge about effectively dealing with trauma survivors can be utilized to augment training.

Since 2002, Mr. Thomas has served as program administrator for domestic violence education at Johns Hopkins University. He teaches courses related to violence against women on the graduate and undergraduate levels. Mr. Thomas also provides trainings on many topics regionally, nationally, and internationally. He provides technical assistance as well as curriculum and policy development to law enforcement, prosecutors, judges, and numerous government and private stakeholders across the nation. His career has also included positions in law enforcement and state government. Mr. Thomas is the author of numerous publications related to domestic violence and sexual assault.

He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration and History from Towson State University in Towson, Maryland and a Master of Science degree in State and Local Government Administration from the University of Maryland. Mr. Thomas completed course work in Paralegal Studies and earned a certificate in Advanced Trauma Treatment.

This presentation will accomplish the following objectives:

- Identify epidemiology and transmission of pediatric STI's.

As clinical director of Forensic Nursing Services for Memorial Hermann Health System, Ms. Ferrell oversees the provision of comprehensive evaluations on adults and children of physical and sexual assault. She provides staff training for 10 hospitals and a Children's Advocacy Center, meeting the needs of approximately 1,700 victims annually.

She has 35 years of experience as a Registered Nurse with extensive practice in Emergency/ Trauma Care. Her 25 years as a practicing Forensic Nurse/Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner began in Amarillo, where she became a catalyst for change for sexual assault victims on the state, national, and international levels. Ms. Ferrell was an originating task force member of the Texas State Evidence Collection Protocol and established Texas' certification and standardized education for SANE's while employed in the Office of the Attorney General. She was a founding board member of the International Association of Forensic Nurses and was a founding board member of The Bridge Children's Advocacy Center in Amarillo.

In 2012, Ms. Ferrell received the prestigious Robert C. Hanna Award recognizing her outstanding performance in improving quality care and outcomes for victims.
