Purpose Statement: To provide technical training in Computer Information Systems for academic, technical and customized contract training classes.

Goal Statement #1: Students completing the CIS core requirement (foundation) classes have the necessary skills to be employed in a modern business environment.

Objectives/Outcomes (including assessment tools and standards): Using an embedded test format 80% of the students completing the CIS foundation classes will answer 7 out of 10 questions demonstrating an acceptable understanding of Information Technology processes in the work place.

Results: 85% of the tested students scored better than the minimum score of 70 on the embedded Information Technology foundation test.
