Director's Report	Talkington talked about the faculty history, 2010 accreditation site review with seven years granted, Sparks resignation, 2011 state budget cuts, and how adjunct faculty will fill Sparks' position. She also showed bar graphs of the increase in applicants, increase in students accepted into the program, graduated with A.A.S., passing first time test takers, employed at 6 months, and an increase in students who entered the program from 2004-2010. Talkington also showed graphs of the program trends of increases in applications, students accepted, fall to fall enrollment, pass rates, and employment. The vision of the OTA program is "ACHIEVE SUSTAINABILITY" and their mission is "attract and retain a peak number of applicants who will progress through the program to graduate and then achieve national certification status". Talkington talked about recruitment efforts, and showed a professionally produced student and PD clips. Also, Jennie Sparks received the Badger of Honor last semester which is an award in teaching excellence that is voted on by the students.
