Curriculum – 1337 TV Production	Revisions to Comm 1337 TV Production were discussed. Instructor Abel has made changes to include the instruction of			
	DLSR cameras to better suit the needs of the photography students. Student in Comm 1337 learn field shooting and			
	editing (using AVID). AVID prepares the students to be able to use other editing software. Concepts such as			
	composition, framing and lighting are taught. Photo students use the DSLR cameras for their projects; although, they

noted that membership and the opportunities to participate in workshops and trips is a valuable experience for			
students. Taylor-Gore suggested possible Art Force funding for these trips.			
Taylor-Gore noted that due to high enrollment for the Spring 2012 semester, PHTC 2343 Portfolio Development			
(Photography) and ARTC 2343 Portfolio Development (Graphic Design) would possibly be split. Cavanaugh noted that			
the Portfolio class presents the opportunity to bring in professionals. Cavanaugh noted that while Pete Gonzalez,			
instructor of Graphic Design and instructor of Portfolio classes brings in professionals, he has difficulty with the PHTC			
2343 students because of his limited exposure with photography. Pirtle noted that combining the photo and graphic			
design portfolio classes has always been an issue but was combined because of enrollment. Taylor-Gore suggested			
offering PHTC 2343 only in the spring, while offering ARTC 2343 each semester. Committee unanimously agrees that			
the portfolio classes need to be separate to allow for more specific instruction. Members were invited to visit the			
portfolio class as professionals and all agreed they would be willing. Cavanaugh suggested the development of a			
packet on starting a business.			
Cavanaugh reminded members that students are always in need of paid and unpaid internship opportunities. Ebling			
suggested a listing of potential students that could possibly be matched up with area professionals.			
A brief discussion followed regarding the resurgence of darkroom/wet film work and how important it is for photo			
students to gain film experience. Committee unanimously agreed that this is one of the advantages of taking			
photography at AC.
