CTL Course Development Stipend Policy

In the past faculty have received a stipend each time a course was developed to be delivered online. Council members have asked for clarification of policy. Procedures need to be developed and adopted for compensation of faculty for course development. Russell asked Patsy to develop a proposal and bring it to the Committee.
