Program Update, Curriculum Overview	Copies of curriculum and course descriptions were included in members' packets. There have been some char this academic year. Classes have been added for transformers skills and substation skills. The practicum class deleted but the cooperative class remains giving students a chance to work as an intern for one semester. Stu must pass a DOT physical and have a CDL before they complete the program. When Terry first received his degree, he worked for two years a an engineer with Xcel Energy and the last two years before he took over the Utility Power Worker program, he taught in the Wind Energy program. Terry mentioned that at this point there is no need to hire other instructors for this program. The program has changed the name from Electrical Lineman to Utility Power Worker in order to keep with gender correctness. It also fits in better with industry in that there is more to this career field than just "electrical
