The Interior Design program will provide design education and training as preparation for articulation into accredited interior design programs at the university level or as decorating practitioners in the regional workforce (AC Strategic Plan through 2015: Strategy 1.5).

Goal Statement #1: Prepare students to enter the workforce in interior design-related positions of employment Outcome/Objective Statement

Upon completion of the Professional Certificate, Interior Design majors will have compiled a body of work in portfolio format to reflect a professional level of achievement to be reviewed by prospective employers.

- Results (Provide Numbers and Percentages for Quantitative Data)
  - 2008-2009 Data: Numbers = 3 out of 3 students and Percentage =s 100 %

    Ten students graduated from the program. 2 graduated with the professional certificate and both compiled portfolios (100%). Of the graduates, 3 were employed in the field at the time of graduation with one employed outside the field, but completing independent (self-employed) projects in the field of Interior Design. Of the 4 students selected to be surveyed for graduate follow-up, 3 students were employed and 1 student had enrolled in a 4-year design program.
  - o **2009-2010 Data:** Numbers = <u>3</u> out of <u>3</u> and Percentage =s <u>100</u> %

    While no students graduated from the Professional Certificate, 5 students graduated from the AAS option.

    Of the students selected to be surveyed for graduate follow-up, all were employed
