Students enrolled in Music Appreciation, American Music, Rudiments of Music and Foundations of Music will take a pre-test at the beginning of each semester, and post-test at end of semester, showing an improvement of 30 % or more. (Revised 4/11/08)

- Pre-test average: 53.27% for 108 students. Post-test average: 84.01 % for 104 students.
Improvement of 31.26%

- **2010-2011 Data:**

- Pre-test average: 51.26% for 155 students. Post-test average: 82.05% for 121 students.
Improvement of 30.79%
