Purpose Statement (With Last Updated Date): Provide Instruction and Experience in the Theatre Arts to majors and non-majors of the performing arts. (updated 01/30/2013)

Goal Statement #1:

Amarillo College Theatre Arts will provide a Freshman/Sophomore curriculum that prepares a student for transfer to a senior level Theatre Arts program (AC Strategic Plan through 2015: Strategy 1.7; No Excuses: Persistence).

Outcome/Objective Statement

Upon leaving the AC program, 25% of all Theatre majors exiting AC will enroll, in the semester immediately following his/her last at AC, in a senior level theatre arts program in an accredited institution.

Benchmark was met. One of the remaining two students has enrolled in the American Academy of Dramatic Arts (a non-accredited institution). An increase of 16.7% was seen in 2011-2012.

 Successful One student enrolled at an accredited four-year institution as a Theatre major; one enrolled at a non-accredited institution for theatre; the third student has not enrolled while she awaits the graduation of her fiancé. An increase of 16.7% was seen in 2011-2012.

Goal Statement #2:

Amarillo College Theatre Arts will prepare majors for entrance into a related profession in Theatre Arts through careful evaluation and counseling.

Outcome/Objective Statement

(Be sure to include audience, behavior, conditions, degree/benchmark, and evaluation method):

All AC Theatre majors will participate in departmental juries at the end of each semester. a) Acting majors will present two contrasting monologues; b) Design majors will present a portfolio of their design work; c) Acting/Design majors will present one monologue and a portfolio of their design work. 70% of Theatre majors will score a 2 or better on a 0-4 rubric scale marking improvement over the semester: 0 = 0% improvement; 4 = 100% improvement. The jury panel will be a three-member panel consisting of AC Theatre Arts faculty and staff.

 - o **2010-2011 Data:** Numbers = 21 out of 24 and Percentage =s 87.5 %
 - o **2011-2012 Data:** Numbers = <u>25</u> out of <u>28</u> and Percentage =s <u>89.3</u> %

 While the benchmark of 70% was met in both years the data shows a 1.8% increase in students scoring a 2 or better in the most recent year.

Amarillo College Theatre Arts will provide majors and non-majors a visual/performing arts core curriculum to be applied towards a general, liberal arts education.

Outcome/Objective Statement

Upon completion of DRAM 1310, 1351, or 2366 (the three general education core offerings in Theatre Arts), 80% of students pursuing an Associate's Degree (with the Visual/Performance Arts requirement) will score at least a 2.0 GPA in any of the aforementioned courses satisfying their specific degree plan (No Excuses: Completion of Courses with a Grade of "C" or Higher).

 - o **2010-2011 Data:** Numbers = <u>181</u> out of <u>270</u> and Percentage =s <u>68.3</u>%
 - o **2011-2012 Data:** Numbers = <u>296</u> out of <u>414</u> and Percentage =s <u>71.5</u> %

 Benchmark was not met.
- Improvements
 - o List any Improvements Made in the **2011-2012** (Last Academic) Year Based on the **2010-2011** PET Results: Instructors made a concerted effort to contact the students who missed more than 3 classes.
 - o Evaluate Why Improvements Were Successful/Were Not Successful: Numerous students did not respond to Instructors' contact attempts. Instructors have decided to maintain high standards for classes and students and make no changes to "Outcome/Objective Statement" at this time. Again, each of the courses had a drop in the success rate of all students earning a 2.0. While the benchmark was not met the data shows an increase of 3.2% over the previous year.
