Program Director	Rowh reported that the first time pass rate for the students this summer was 67%. Rowh and Rocsko have now changed the capstone at 75% or better on all tests starting this fall. If a student fails one test, they must remediate. If they the second test they are asked to withdraw from the program. Students are required to study more at home and to come to class prepared and to do activities. There also is a processing station in the lab that students have access to as well. All programs at the junior college level in the state of Texas will be required to lower their program curriculum to 60 credit hours. Currently, this program is at 72 credit hours.
