Completion of Certificates and Associate Degrees – As of 2012 – 9 Associates degree students and 2

certificate, and 2013 - 7 certificates for spring, summer and fall and 7 Associates degree students graduated. Work Source and TEACH Scholarships – There's over 40 students with Workforce Solutions and TEACH on scholarships. We would like to see every director have an associate degree if not more. No Excuses – No Excuses is to raise expectations. Damon Lopez is working on spear heading efforts for those who are amidst the disadvantaged in our community. Jill Goodrich stated the Opportunity School is the first preschool in the US to be a No Excuses campus. They are the first stand-alone, preschool to do so outside of the public schools. TSR! - Is the preschool initiative across Texas begun at Children's Learning Institute – UT-HSC. Cheri Sherley and Whitney Nestlehut coordinate and mentor in the project. The new TSR! 2013-2015 grants are for three and four year old children and teachers. This grant focuses on Head Start, Child Care and Registered Homes. We were able to recruit ten Registered Homes, who received curriculum material and an online training. Whitney has new equipment to provide video responses. Cheri Sherley is teaching the class face to face and coordinating the program. The grant is also to provide training for the Infant and Toddler Guidelines. The Texas Early Learning Council published them this summer and the TRS will do training for Early Learning Guidelines. TAEYC provided training also at conferences. Mary Clare has done a training this fall on the guidelines with her management students. Whitney and Cheri are going to provide a free training for everybody on February 1, 2014. New Business: Report on Newest Goals DEGREE PLANS AND NEW CORE REQUIREMENTS - Mary Clare states that the Higher Education State Board has asked every program to make sure they are no more than 60 credits. Right now our Child Development program is 66 credits we are changing our program to 60 credits. Under EDUC we are already at 60 credits. CHANGES IN TESTING (TSI) - We did have changes in TSI and that is going to affect students. Amarillo College has chosen to have all students take TSI testing even though military and level I certificate programs are exempt on the state level. PAEYC AND AC EDUC/CDEC COLLABORATION – Rochelle Fouts states there are two conferences offered a year. This year we are collaborating with different people. Teresa Chavez from Child Care Services and our partners are offering a preschool training collaborating with TSR Infant Toddler training on February 1. We are offering a couple of nights of 2 hour training. Sondra Tolliver from the Lab School is the leader. Dates for training – February 1, 2014 Infant Toddler Guideline training held at Region 16; February 22, 2014, a PAEYC conference focusing on preschool teachers. We will have 8 different sessions and can choose 4 from the 8 sessions. Teresa is working on a Director's Retreat in March or April. We will finalize the dates in spring for 2 hour training once a month probably on Thursday nights. Mary Clare's Director's Leadership Circle meets once a month at lunch on Wednesday. In April the Week of the Young Child will be celebrated. GRANT - Children Learning Institute received money to Improve Teachers' Preparation. We wrote for the
