MCC Blackboard Issues

In December all MCC instructors did not have gradebooks created in Blackboard. This semester Charles Hendrick researched the MCC courses in Blackboard and

discovered numerous problems in the gradebook. All assignments must be included in the online syllabus and gradebook to provide students with access to information throughout the semester.

Although these issues were identified by Moore County, the same issues are likely occurring across all campuses. Russell stressed the need to have all faculty learn to accurately and consistently use the technology for the success of students.

New Business

We must stop thinking in terms of 16-week traditional scheduling and schedule courses based on the needs of specific programs.
