Chief Chance stated that this presentation has been revised to one hour (30 minutes presentation/30 minutes Q&A). He stated that the training will again be revised next year to include campus carry. Corporal Acker then presented his power point presentation reviewing the five stages of an active shooter and explaining the three ways to react – ADD: Avoid (run); Deny (hide); Defend (fight). He also reviewed appropriate responses to law enforcement when they arrive and signs of potential workplace violence by individuals. The first three trainings are full. The President's office will have their 19-hour employee and student worker attend the trainings. The police are changing their uniforms somewhat to project a more friendly presence and hope that these changes along with the trainings will instill confidence in faculty and staff. Corporal Acker is available to go to specific offices and buildings to assess the space and make suggestions for safety. Once campus carry is in place, these same rules will apply.

Note on campus carry gun-free zones: AC is currently reviewing the university level restrictions approved. which include dorms, testing centers, and day care centers, not offices or classrooms.
