BRANCH CAMPUS COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVES TO BOARD OF REGENTS:

Dr. Lowery-Hart explained that the Bryan/College Station Campus of Blinn College is not pleased that they do not have representation on the Blinn Board; the legislature is looking into

this situation; Amarillo College will try to get ahead of a legislative mandate and include representation from both communities of Dumas and Hereford. Other community colleges which may have a problem and do not have branch campus representatives are Frank Phillips College and Howard College. Attached at page 272 is a list of branch campus representative expectations, qualifications and selection. Attorney Mark White requested modification to the attachment which includes that a representative shall be available to attend substantially all Amarillo College Board meetings each year.

Dr. Nossaman moved, seconded by Mr. Mize to approve the request and selection of representatives from the Branch Campus communities to serve as non-voting members on the Amarillo College Board of Regents. The motion carried unanimously.

Branch Campus Community Representative To Board of Regents (Non-Voting)

Each branch campus of Amarillo College may have a non-voting community representative sit with the Board of Regents and participate in its activities to the extent allowed by law.

Branch Campus Representative Expectations

- Representative shall be available to attend eight (8) evening AC Board of Regents meetings per year plus special called meetings and AC events requiring Regents' presence
- Representative shall attend Board Member training seminar(s) and retreats
- Representative may serve on Board of Regent Committees at the discretion of the AC Board Chair
- Representative term shall be 4 years

Qualifications and Selection

- The Branch Campus Nonvoting Representative to the AC Board of Regents shall be a (current or former) member of the respective Branch Campus Advisory Committee having served on the advisory committee a minimum of one (1) year
- The Branch Campus Advisory Committee and the AC President shall recommend two nominees
- The nominees shall submit a letter of interest with qualifications and commitment to serve to the AC Board of Regents
- Candidates may be interviewed by the AC Board of Regents
- The Board of Regents shall make the final selection
