Old Business:	This is the first meeting for the HVACR Advisory meetings. All Advisory Committee meetings before were representative of each individual program within the department.

	Welcome and introductions were made. Delane McUne went over the meeting agenda. She explained some of the requirements contained in the Advisory Committee Handbook that was included in members' packets. Delane discussed need of a Committee Chair, Frank Wilburn Sr. was appointed and called the meeting to order.	
New Business:		
	Copies of curriculum rotations were included in members' packets. Delane mentioned that many classes are shared between the programs. Jerry Terry explained what the new Technical Core was and the value it brings to the students. Janice Johnston had industry to approve curriculum and sign off for the DOL Grant.	
Curriculum Decisions:		

Bob Johnson: HVACR	Bob explained the curriculum rotation for the HVACR program, including brief descriptions of each class. Entry level is different from company to company. The students are trained to follow EPA certification standards. The HVACR students usually are highly recommended to have the EPA certification. Our students did very well the last time this testing was done. Several employers said they are very happy with the students they have hired. Bob included that we do encourage our students to go online to get their technician cards. Bob discussed the equipment we have on site to train students.
Other:	
Open Discussion:	There was a lengthy discussion about what industry thinks we need to focus on making sure our students know. Guadalupe Compos, Jr. asked about the quality of teaching about heat pumps. He stated he hired 2 of our students and felt they didn't have enough knowledge about them. Bob talked about the simplicity of heat pumps and thanked Guadalupe for his input. There was discussion of new items in the market that will need to be taught and included in the classes. There was a lengthy discussion of students needing to know accurately what kind of position they will get when they graduate and the salary ranges for starting employees.
Open Discussion:	There was a lengthy discussion about internships for the students. They could prove to be a good investment for both students and employers. Internships help students by tying what they are learning to what they are working on in their jobs. Several spoke up saying they would love to offer internships to students.
Open Discussion:	It was pointed out that sometimes our students get jobs before they finish their program, but then their employer won't work with them to allow them to finish school. More and more State funding is being tied into "completers". The requirement is gradually evolving to having 15 completers in three years or lose funding. It was mentioned that an intern program where students sign contracts - students commit to college and company. Helps completion rate and employers already know who they get to work for them.
