

	<p>Dale Davis called the meeting to order at 12:00. He asked for a motion to approve minutes from the August 12, 2015, meeting. Terry Easterling made a motion to approve the minutes, Carmen Napp seconded the motion, and motion was carried.</p>		
Education Report:	<p>Eric turned it over to Suzie Wheeler. She spoke about the Perkins grant and how it is funding an upcoming integrated workshop for females in Criminal Justice. The first part of the workshop will be with speaker Lisa Marie Platske. Then the second part will include students interested in criminal justice careers speaking with criminal justice professionals. The professionals could also serve as mentors for the students.</p>		
PRIEA Update:	<p>The 112th Academy started in October 2015. There are 23 in the class (lost 1) 16 A's, 7 B's. They will be having their SFST this week, then on to CIT, Mechanics of Arrest, Patrol Procedures, and Firearms. They will graduate March 10th.</p> <p>The 113th started January 19, 2016, starting with 25 recruits. They will graduate August 25, 2016.</p> <p>Dale Davis congratulated the Board members in doing such a good job coming to the graduations.</p> <p>Hank will start the interview process for the 114th in May.</p> <p>Hank has been doing some updating on the Rules and Regulations Manual for the academy. One comment was made about changing the language to reflect tolerance. Another suggestion was about maybe adding a part on social media. All classroom course will be moved to 8 week blocks in the fall. Criminal justice enrollment this spring compared to last spring is up over 40%. Most of the increase is in the 8 week classes.</p>
