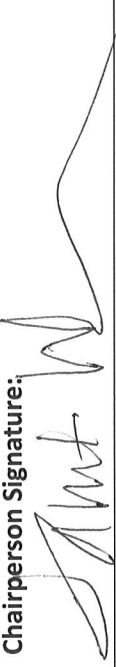

New Business:	Dale Davis called the meeting to order at 12:12. He asked for a motion to approve minutes from January 20, 2016. Greg Daniels made a motion to approve the minutes, Dennis Rice seconded the motion, and motion was carried. Voted on Four Price on becoming a member. Dennis Rice made the motion and April Leming second. Four Price was voted in. Lucinda Russell spoke of Kim Reece DPS Supervisor in Communications. Greg Daniel made motion. Brent Harrison second the motion. Kim Reece was voted in. Anthony Harris was visiting and will be voted on next meeting. Chief Davis also asked about the Rules & Regulations for the academy. Hank said he will have them changed and ready for the next academy.	
Education Report: Eric	Eric spoke of all the changes and ways college is working with the community. 70% of people in Amarillo do not have a degree. 61% of high school students choose Amarillo College. The other half choose not to go to college at all. Amarillo College had to reduce its budget by 3.5 million without raising tuition or taxes. Amarillo College gave a retirement package to persons of retirement age. 60 people took the retirement and 20 of those jobs were not refilled. Only 1% of that was faculty. Amarillo College impact on local economy was \$660.1 million. Also, Amarillo College implemented new business-based and service values that all employees should live by: wow, innovation, family, fun, and yes. There are several unique things AC does to help students: Presidential Honors Scholarship, 8 week classes, and student excellence. Many ways people can help being a mentor: AC Foundation, and student support (food pantry or clothing closet). Eric also provided an overview of the Criminal Justice Programs. He included recent attendance and contact hours for each program area: PRLEA Academy, in-service training for law enforcement, specialized training, TDCJ, Intervention Programs, and the two criminal justice academic degrees.	
PRLEA Update: Hank	The 113 th Academy went from 25 in the class to 22. 14 A's 8 B's. Second semester starts Tuesday May 17 th . Graduation for the 113 th is August 25, 2016.	
In-Service Programs: Hank	Firearms Instructor starts May 16 th . 3 openings left. June 16 th K-9 Encounters class starts. This is a mandated class. Planning to offer Advanced Instructor class, maybe September or October.	
Specialized Training: Eric	Specialized training has Preventing the Escape coming up May 31-June 2 for the first time, National Polygraph class coming in June for 10 weeks. 14 people so far signed up. Building Warrior Women 1 2 or 3 day event, in June. MCTC will be having some classes coming up. Intoxilyzer Training class June 20 th -24 th .	
Intervention Programs: Raul	All intervention classes going steady. Currently looking for another DWI Repeat Offender Instructor. Working with Tobacco Free Amarillo for free tobacco cessation classes.	
Academic Update: Sarah	All online courses went 8-week format this fall. Lecture courses will also be 8-week starting Fall 2016. We had an almost 40% increase of enrollment for online classes. At the end of semester, we ask for student feedback on the 8-week format. It was 100% positive.	

	We introduced a new monthly Facebook post featuring an Online Student of the Month. This helps highlight and engage students that are not in the traditional class environment. Also, each semester, students have brought non-perishable food and hygiene items for the West Campus Food Pantry in exchange for extra credit.
Committee Roundtable:	Greg Daniels asked if a person with years of experience could convert that into college hours. Amarillo College has already started to look into this. Amarillo College does have a few ways that experience can convert. Some areas offer tests, others by paying a fee. Greg also mentioned Drone training. FAA is working on getting some information together. Might be able to turn into class when we receive it. One place Amarillo College knows of has the training, but, it is very expensive. Chief Davis asked about starting lunch at 11:45 in the future so that the meeting could begin at noon. Next meeting: August 10, 2016 starting @ 12:00. Meeting was adjourned at 1:39.
