#### **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS**

#### ARTC 2311 - History of Communication Graphics

Survey of the evolution of graphic arts as it relates to the history of art. Topics include formal, stylistic, social, political, economic and historical aspects. Emphasis on the movement, schools of thought, individuals and technology as they interrelate with graphic arts.

Hours (3 sem hrs; 3 lec, 1 lab)

End-of-Course Outcomes: Identify major art and design styles from the past; recognize techniques and media used in graphic arts; relate historic styles and their influence to the present; and recognize prominent graphic artists and their contribution to the development of popular styles.

#### ARTS 2323 - Life Drawing I

Prerequisite: ARTS 1317

Basic study of the human form. Hours (3 sem hrs; 2 lec, 4 lab)

Texas Common Course Number: ARTS 2323

Learning Outcomes - Upon successful completion of this course, students will: Describe visual subjects through the use of accurate and sensitive observation. Generate drawings which demonstrate descriptive, expressive, and conceptual approaches with an increased focus on individual expression. Utilize varied materials and techniques, including color media, with informed aesthetic and conceptual strategies. Demonstrate an appropriate level of professional practice, including safety, craft and presentation. Analyze and critique drawings verbally and/or in writing. Relate their drawings to historical and contemporary developments in the field.

### ARTS 2316 - Painting I

Prerequisites: ARTS 1311 and ARTS 1317

Exploration of the potentials of painting media with emphasis on color and composition. Regular outside assignments.

#### ARTS 1304 - Art History II

A chronological analysis of the historical and cultural contexts of the visual arts from the 14th century to the present day. Hours (3 sem hrs; 3 lec)

Learning Outcomes Upon successful completion of this course, students will: Identify and describe works of art based on their chronology and style, using standard categories and terminology. Investigate major artistic developments and significant works of art from the 14th century to the present day. Analyze the relationship of art to history by placing works of art within cultural, historical and chronological contexts. Critically interpret and evaluate works of art.
