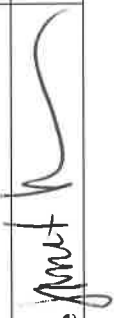

New Business:		Dale Davis called the meeting to order at 12:00. He asked for a motion to approve minutes from the May 10, 2017 meeting. Brent Harrison made a motion to approve the minutes, Four Price seconded the motion, and motion was carried.	
Education Report:		Eric introduced Danette Fenstermaker and Maury Roman-Jordan with Outreach Services here at Amarillo College. Outreach Services go to job fairs, and they develop relationships with businesses to help employees be better educated. That might mean they start college for the first time or return to work on getting a certificate or Associates degree. Outreach Services target persons who are 25 or older. They can go to the employer and meet with new or former students to see what they will need to start college or continue forward. Outreach Services will be able to help students with admissions, advising, and financial aid all at one time. They talked about the work they have already done with law enforcement and their willingness to continue those efforts.	
PRLEA Update:		The 116th Academy is in their 2nd semester. There are 20 in the class. They will be getting into the majority of the practical aspects of the academy during the 2nd semester. They will graduate March 8, 2018. 117th Academy will start January 16, 2018. There are 21 students; six of those will receive PRPC scholarships. Law Enforcement Job Fair is on January 19, 2018 here on the West Campus. PRLEA students can meet with area law enforcement agencies. Let us now if you still need a table. 118th Academy interviews start in May 2018. TCOLE will be adding 60-80 hours to BPOC. Getting rid of redundancy and more scenario based training. Expect new curriculum by March.
