New Business:	<p>Dale Davis called the meeting to order at 12:10. He asked for a motion to approve minutes from the August 10, 2016, meeting. Dennis Rice made a motion to approve the minutes, Harry Hueston seconded the motion, and motion was carried. Chief Davis then asked Eric for the Education Report.</p>		
Education Report:	<p>Eric introduced Chris Forbis and Tim Williams. They are instructors that will be teaching a class called Active Threat Integrated Response Training. This class is for law enforcement, EMS, and fire. It is a class that will teach what needs to be done after the active shooter is caught. The scenario is a medical triage. There will be 6 classes available 4 in Amarillo, 1 in Hereford, and 1 in Dumas.</p>		
PRL&A Update:	<p>The 114th Academy finished their 1st semester. There are 21 in the class (lost 1) 10 A's, 11 B's. They will be getting into the majority of the practical aspects of the academy. They will graduate March 9, 2017.</p> <p>115th Academy-Hank interviewed 32 applicants. A couple withdrew their applications, and trying to finish up some backgrounds. We have 3 Agency letters requesting PRL&C Scholarships, but only one student has applied.</p> <p>115th Academy will start January 17, 2017.</p> <p>At the TCOLE Conference in October, we learned of several curriculum committees working on rewrites of all licensing courses. We expect to see these changes in January 2018.</p> <p>In-Service Training:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Supervisor going through end of week. 35 people in that class. • Canine Encounters: 2 sessions on January 12th. Morning and afternoon. • Legislative Updates 3184: February 10th • Advanced Instructor; we had 9 in that class. <p>Some classes we are waiting to hear from instructor on are: Special Investigative Topics, CIT Update, Missing & Exploited Children, Cultural Diversity, Intermediate Child Abuse, Intermediate Arrest, Search & Seizure, and Interacting with Deaf & Hard of Hearing.</p>

Also, PLETS.org a PRPC site that lets all agencies advertise their training. You can email Lori Gunn and she will put it on there for you.</p> <p>Amarillo College has another contract with PRPC that will offer courses to persons that work with victims of human trafficking, sexual assault, or domestic violence. These courses must take place before the end of August.</p>
Intervention Programs:	<p>Raul gave updates on Intervention Programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Has a new DWI Repeat Offender instructor which should prevent the need for waiting lists. • Fight Like a Girl is doing well. Last 2 classes full. There is an advanced class. • Youth tobacco classes. AISD will make a student take the class if caught on campus.
Academic Update:	<p>Toni needed the Advisory Board to vote on changes to the AAS Degree before we take them before the Curriculum Committee. Changes eliminate courses that are no longer being offered. Brent Harrison made motion to approve. Bill McLean seconded the motion, and it was approved.</p> <p>A few new adjunct faculty members: Richard Webb, Tina Babb, and April Leming.</p> <p>Still having continued success on the 8 week courses.</p> <p>Working on expanding dual credit programs for Fall 2017. In January meeting with Tascosa, Dumas, Hereford, and Canyon.</p> <p>At our April meeting Greg Daniel brought up giving credit for experience and /or continuing education hours. Over the summer Eric, Raul, and Sarah did attend a PLA conference to discuss that process. We have come up with a proposal to offer this for 3 courses: Criminal Investigations, Police Systems and Practices, and Court Systems and Practices. Greg Daniel made motion, seconded by Dennis Rice and it was approved.</p>
