Education Report:	<p>Eric let everyone know that August 1<sup>st</sup> all Amarillo College campuses are smoke-free. He also let everyone know that the Board of Regents voted to not raise taxes or tuition at this time.</p> <p>Sarah discussed the transition from traditional 16-week courses to expedited 8-week format for online courses. We saw a large increase in enrollment. In class courses will go to 8-week format in the Fall. So far, the Fall enrollment is looking good. We are trying to explore ways of getting people credit for prior experience. Eric, Raul, and Sarah went to a conference on that topic. They hope to have more information by next meeting.</p>		
PRLEA Update:	<p>The 113th Academy started in January 2016. There are 21 in the class (lost 4) 15 A's, 6 B's. They will be finishing up Patrol Procedures.
