Moller met with Diane Brice and she indicated that summer online courses do not have consistent start dates. She may be contacting the Divisions to confirm the accuracy of the dates submitted for the online summer courses. Originally,

summer online courses were scheduled to start two weeks after the start date of the Summer term in order to accommodate high school graduates and students home from universities for the summer.

# Community College Day at the Capitol

Matney attended Community College Day at the Capitol. He was very impressed with the students in attendance. Seliger, Heflin, Lewis and Smithee met with the students and were very accommodating. Swinford spent almost an hour in his office with the students. Three of the four state representatives are community college graduates.

# <u>No Excuses University – San Jacinto Elementary</u>

San Jacinto Elementary school implemented a program called No Excuses University designed to increase awareness for college attendance. Every teacher signed up in the program and colleges and universities are adopting classrooms. However, AC was not a part of the program. Representatives from AC are meeting with the principal on Thursday, February 26 to discuss the possibility of adopting the entire school. Because of the focus on college attendance, performance and scores are up throughout the school.

#### **Department Chair Compensation**

Moller, Crawford, Matney and Moore met to discuss the need to update the formula for Department Chair compensation. The formula is significantly is out of

date. The faculty supervisors council recently asked for the formula to be updated. The goal is to simplify the process.

Bill Crawford will chair a committee that will include department chairs and faculty to review the process and develop a recommendation to update the process.
