- Graduation
- Budget The budget is close to being balanced. The state is requiring a 5% reduction from current budget; 5% from upcoming budget. The institution is reviewing areas to reduce expenses including evaluation of the prison programs, not replacing retiree positions, etc.

### Board Meeting

- Board meeting was held in MCC.
- Crawford gave a presentation regarding the implementation of a Sonography program and the Board approved it. The sonography program will begin with only 8 students. There must be a registered sonographer per each student and there are only 8 registered sonographers in Amarillo.
- Fouts reported on a wind energy grant for \$414,000 through Comptroller of Public Accounts which will purchase 2 44-ft mobile training stations. The stations will be located at both the MCC and Hereford campuses and will be available for industry training.
