#### **Re-organization**

Paul Matney distributed a copy of the organizational chart and congratulated to Lou Ann Seabourn on her promotion to Associate Dean of Instruction. She will be adding the Library to her branch. Bob Sloger has been assigned as Director of E-Learning Center. Ron Faulkner will be assigned to Bob's area. Also, Bob will take on Lou Ann's ITV/Telecourses area. Paul welcomed Judy Johnson to the Vice President's Council. She chairs the Academic Development division. She will supervisor of the HEP grant. Ed Nolte is now division chair of Industrial and Transportation Technologies.
