# 1. NAACP SCHOLARSHIP BANQUET

**Lowery-Hart** 

Dr. Lowery-Hart announced that Thursday is the NAACP's Annual Scholarship Banquet. AC will have two tables at the event and we need Cabinet members to attend. Suggestions to fill the table are for PLI members and students.

### 2. TEXAS PATHWAYS DATA

Witherspoon

Collin Witherspoon presented AC data at last week's Texas Pathways conference. He reviewed this data during the cabinet meeting. Data reviewed was for all AC FTIC students in 2014, 2015, and 2016.

- Data metrics reviewed included demographics; enrollment in developmental education; dual credit FTIC; completed college math in year 1; completed college English in year 1; and, completed both college Math and English in year 1
- When reviewing persistence from term 1 to term 2, dev ed students were just as likely to return as students who did not take dev ed
- Students enrolled in dev ed were significantly less likely to take 15+ college credits year
- Students completing attempted courses are at a similar rate whether they are students enrolled in dev ed or credit courses
- Students are much less likely to graduate within 3 years or transfer if they are dev ed students
- Average time to degree is 4.3 years a slight decrease from 2014. Average credits to degree is 84 decrease from 88 in 2014.

# 3. SERVICES TO NON-TRADITIONALLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

Skinner

Ms. Skinner researched several other colleges' approach to how they let students in dual credit, AEL/GED, Continuing Education, ESL programs access institutional student services – such as intramurals, counseling, social services, student life. Discussion was held about whether, and to what extent, Amarillo College should provide the same opportunities to these students. Discussion centered around the rising costs if all these services were open to all students.
