Central New Mexico Community College's President, Dr. Kathie Winograd, introduced her leadership team and lead a presentation discussing their makerspace, FUSE, and entrepreneurial hub, CNM Ingenuity. The FUSE Makerspace is a community center with tools that allow members to design, prototype, and create manufactured works. CNM Ingenuity supports a new approach to education that provides accelerated educational and training opportunities in key workforce areas, wrap-around support for aspiring entrepreneurs, and cooperative ventures that foster economic development and job creation in the region. Following the presentation, Amarillo College attendees were divided into smaller groups to tour the FUSE Makerspace, CNM Ingenuity, and InnovateABQ, which is a public-private partnership created to develop a 7-acre innovation district in downtown Albuquerque to foster economic development and job creation in New Mexico.
