Director's Report	<p>Tamra-Program Director: Program Changes. General Physics I now part of Nuc Med Physics per Accreditation. Accreditation Report submitted. Waiting for feedback. Strategic Plan – Data sets- no change since last meeting. Completion overall – Goal is 70% by 2020. When we started, completion rates were in about 20%, Now over 50% without transfer numbers. 2021 we will have a new plan. Enrollment- 65% of AISD students come to AC. Believe the Thrive Program and events such as 360 has a big impact. A. Caprock, B. Tascosa C. Palo Duro, D. Amarillo High. Tutor in the tutoring center. In Spring will have Nuc Med Tutoring. If score below 80 on Test or math assignment, tutoring is required. Will be fundraising for a Trip in April. Need a location other than San Antonio. TBA. Feedback – 1st year injecting if they can start IV CT Program – only way a person can get credential is on the job training. Question-is there a need? Covenant in Plainview allows CT.
