We had the visit in early October. The staff went to the national conference in Dallas for National Association for the Young Children. The center will start participating in the Gold Assessment project through TAEYC.</li> <li>• <b>Certificates and Associate Degrees by Numbers</b> - Lynda Barksdale reported completion numbers.
