
Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

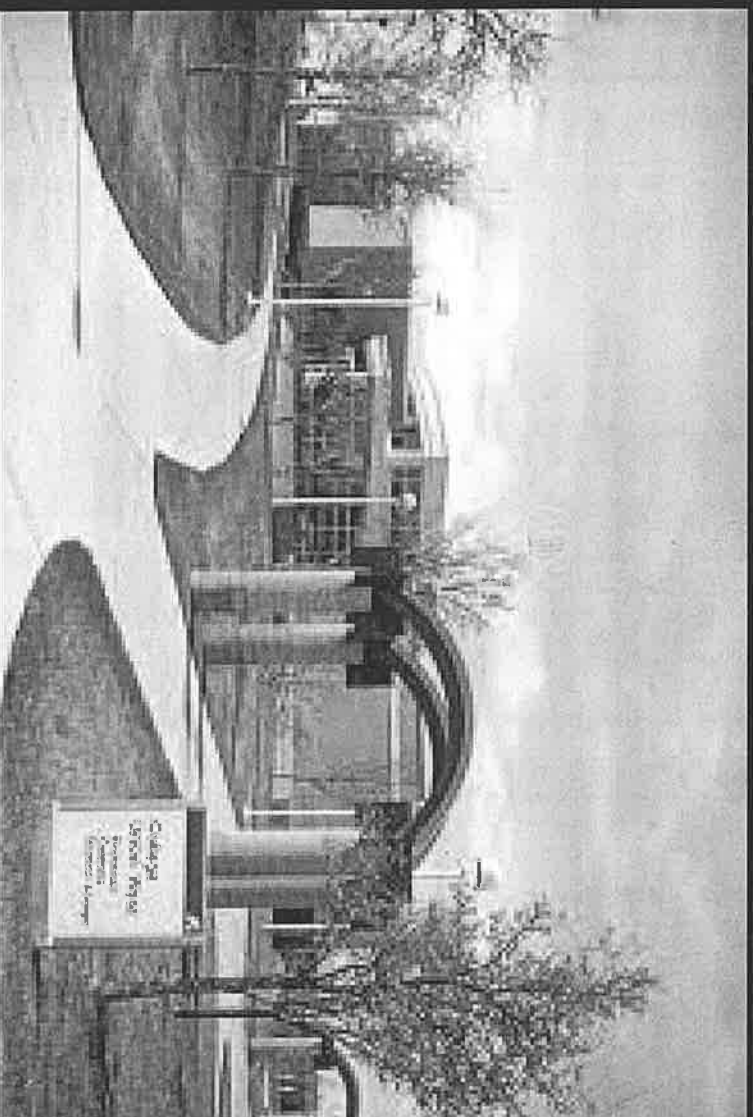
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Director's Report		Tony Tackitt

Tony mentioned that last year he was very supportive of the Argosy situation. There were several transfer issues, old faculty started a program this January. Primary reason students not finishing is working FT. Cannot work 40 hours a week and do well in the program. Tony stated they will have a high attrition rate for 2 nd year class. Any suggestions to help in this area are welcome. None were given, just consensus of understanding of student need to work and balance school time Lindsey stated Tony has said don't make C's. If a student makes A's and B's, they have a good chance of passing AART first time. It was mentioned we need to use various ways to reach out to students. 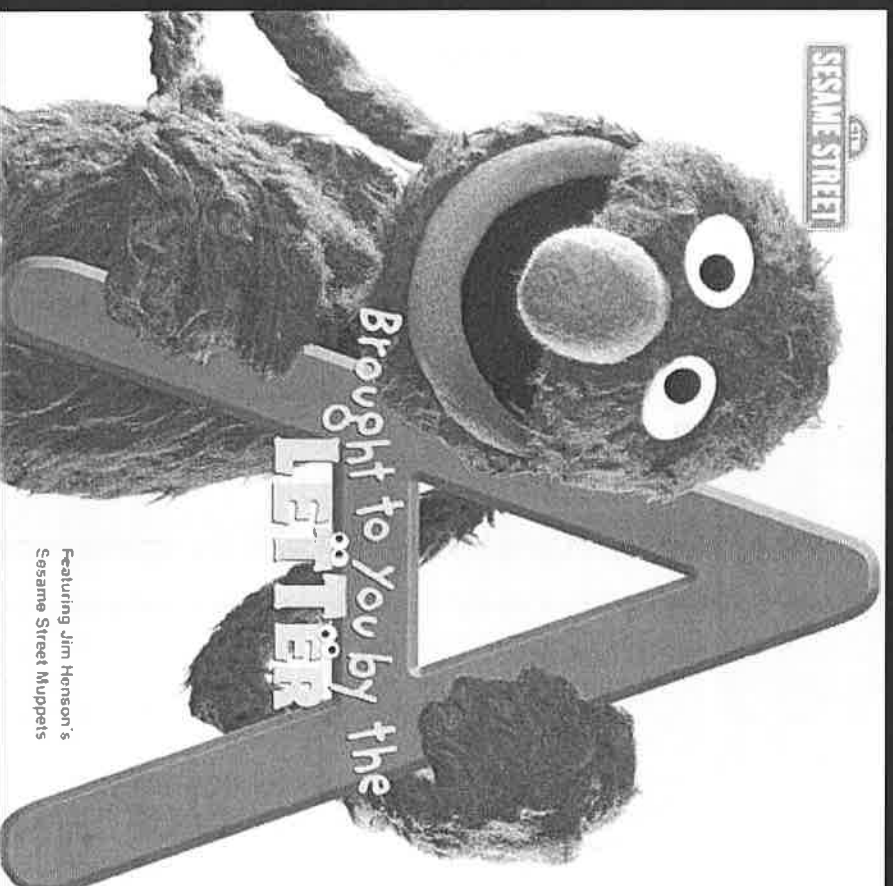
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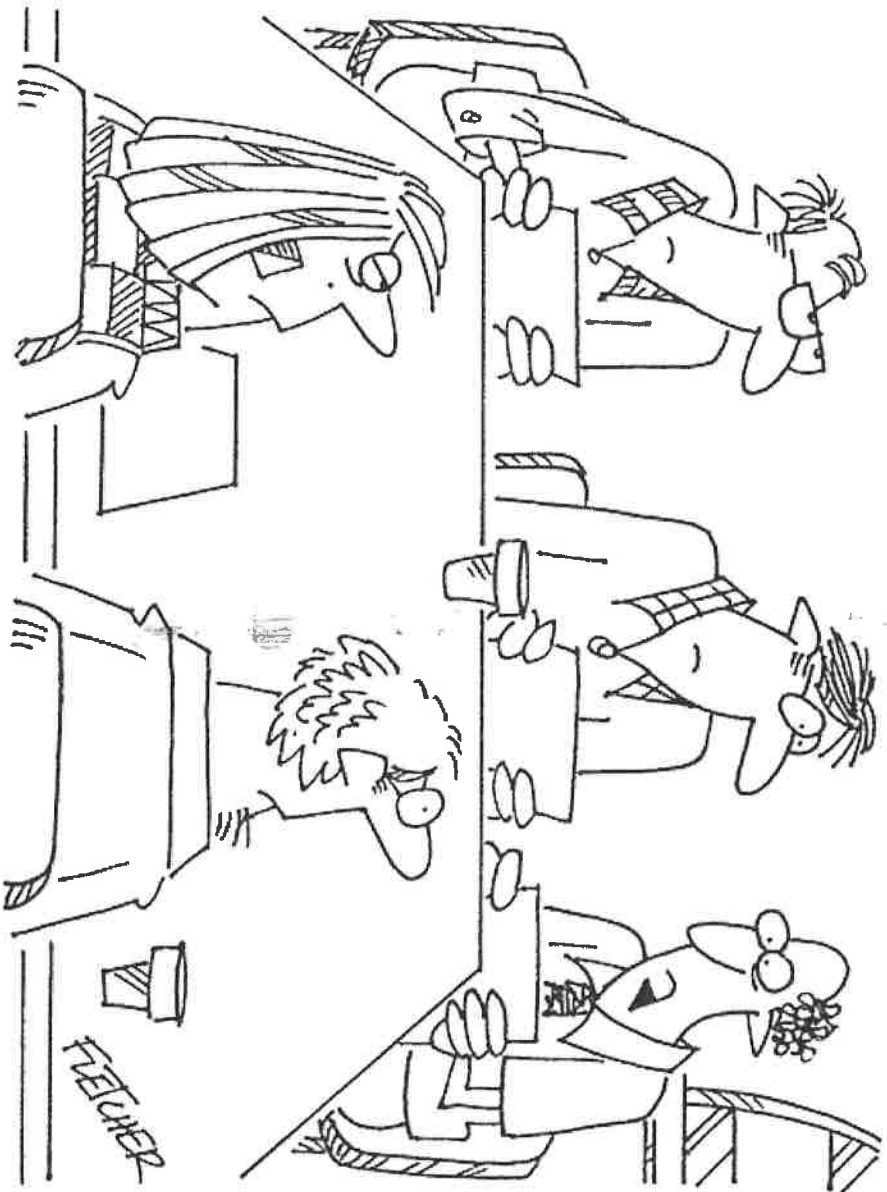
Affiliation Reports	Dale Barker – Texas Oncology – no students at this time. Not sure when they will start taking students again.	Affiliations

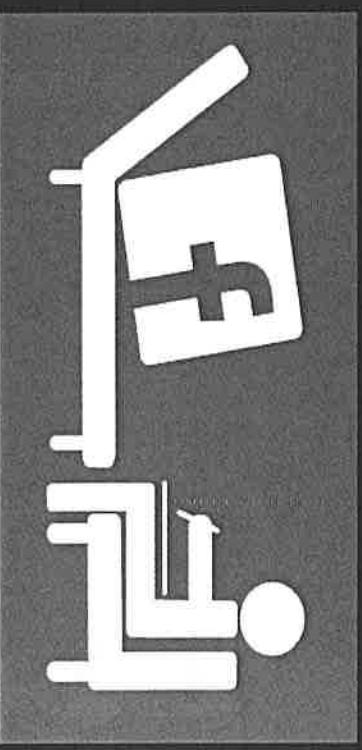

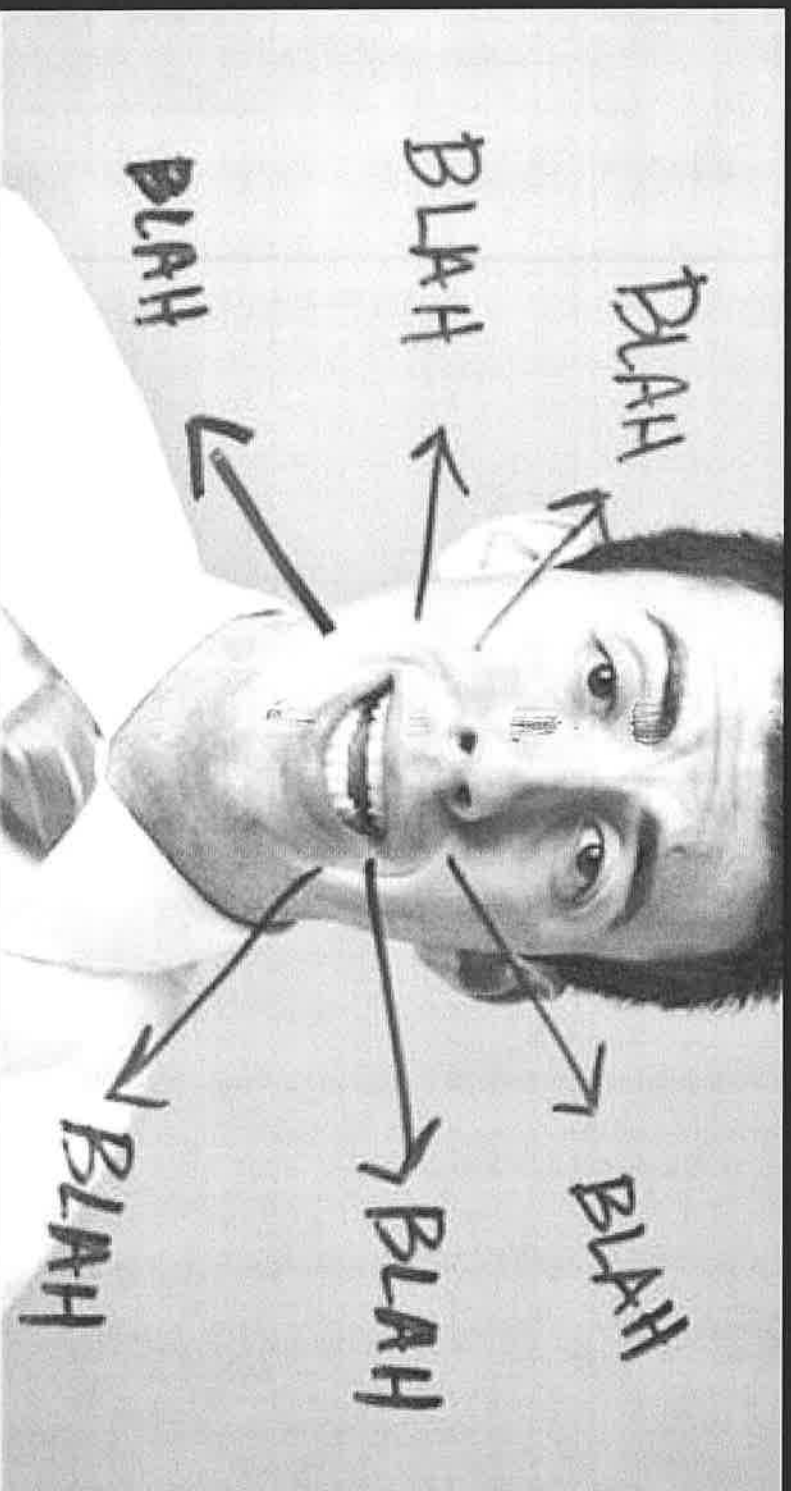
