Ashley Hanks – 1<sup>st</sup> year student. – Ashley stated she has completed 7 barium enemas and it is the end of March. Not seeing them as often but fortunately, they can simulate them. Ashley stated that at certain clinical sites they could not get a pre-comp if they have a repeat. Do all the sites do this? Ashley also stated Tech communication is an issue...needs to be clearer. Ashley also mentioned having to cover tattoos at clinicals. It was voted on at the last meeting. Students were told they will have to cover tattoos for the 21 months they are in the program. Ashley – need clarification on myelogram and arthrograms and certain procedures. Need clarification on what their responsibilities are. Stephen Hamilton – Stephen responded to Ashley -stated they don't do contrast BE's very often. Pre-comps/comps – students get 1 repeat. Stephen also stated if students have questions about their expectations they need to ask the tech.
