Lab practicals, final course grades, practicum grades both Level I and II, certification exam results, job placement rates, employer satisfaction</p>	<p>1. 100% of students were successful in acquiring and maintaining the role of a professional therapy assistant.</p> <p>2. Grade sheets and final examination results determine that students have made and surpassed the 75% passing rate or the course will be repeated. 100% of students successfully passed courses and the certification exam with 75% or better.</p> <p>3. 100% of students enrolled successfully complete all requirements with a grade of 75 or better.</p>	<p>1. If students are not successful, curriculum will be revised, more clinical and coursework will be done to emphasize the professional aspects of the degree program, and more effort will be spent to create a professional atmosphere for students.</p> <p>2. Curriculum will be revised if grades are no longer acceptable or % drop or if students are no longer being successful and cannot perform in clinical experiences.</p> <p>3. Curriculum will be revised if students are not successful, more work will be done with clinical supervisors in the areas of practical applications of skills, and courses will be altered to assure information and skills are assimilated, understood, and practiced.</p>
