<i>(revised February 14, 2007)</i> 1.Student completion of program by completing a comprehensive exit exam that demonstrates preparedness for the national American Registry of Radiologic Technologist.	<i>(revised February 14, 2007)</i> 1a. After successful completion of all RADR courses 70% of all students who begin the program will be able to function in the clinical environment as indicated by a score of no than 75 on the written capstone exam and completion of all required competencies in the clinical setting as evaluated by a clinical instructor. 1b. Eligible students will complete the national ARRT exam within 1 year of completion of the program with a 85% success rate on the first attempt.	1a 86% of the class of 2007 have met this objective. Of the original 29 who started the program, 26 took all courses, 1 was not able to complete requirements. This leaves an attrition of 3students throughout the program. 1b.91% of the eligible graduates successfully passed the ARRT examination on the first attempt.	1a. PLAN: focus on retention efforts by identifying at risk students and have better understanding before they start the program of what is entailed in the program. 1b.Based on the results the faculty will continue to closely monitor objective 1b.
