EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLANNING TO DATE

- Safety Training- Active Shooter Situation- Since 2016, 462 employees have attended this course offered by AC Police
- 22 Employees have attended a CPR/AED course and become certified through the American Heart Association
- All AC Police Officers have attended ATIRC (Advanced Threat Integrated Response Course) Active Shooter Training. In February, all AC Police Officers will go through this course again.
- Emergency management/ campus safety articles in every Badger Buzz starting January 2018
- All AC Cabinet Members have attended four FEMA/Emergency Response courses
- In January of 2018, all members of the AC Emergency Response team attended a week-long advanced emergency management course.
- A meeting with APD Chief of Police Drain, ACPD Chief of Police Stephanie Birkenfeld and other
 college officials is scheduled for early March 2018 to discuss how to better partner together in
 preparedness for emergency response and clarify roles and responsibilities.
- Sent out a call for volunteers to serve as building leaders and provide assistance in the event of an emergency. 39 AC family members responded and volunteered to serve and training for evacuation, shelter in place and other emergency management procedures will begin in March. To ensure adequate coverage of all AC buildings on every campus, the President's Cabinet and Deans Council will identify more employees in order to have at least two trained employees in every building on every campus within the next week.
