

Comprehensive Transfer/Completion Pathways

Increase Completion by improving persistence, decreasing time-to-completion, and creating a comprehensive transfer/completion pathway.

- Reverse transfer is automatic at Texas Tech University and WTAMU.
- The perception at the MCC that the Advocate Resource Center is available and accessible for all students. Have zoom meetings set up for students, or have an advocate come to MCC monthly for students.
- Drop Reduction plan where the student talks with the faculty and advisor about dropping.
 - Explore reasons students drop out and don't return.
 - How can we help them return?

Align Degrees & Certificates with Labor Market Demand

Align Degrees & Certificates with current & new labor laws and market demand by creating structured AC career pathways.

- Housing Our community is hurting for housing and need trained/skilled laborers to meet the need.
