Tamra stated she will put more weight on the Critical Thinking piece. Med Term refresher will continue. Tamra mentioned she has 100% pass rates. John Huse held a boot camp on Physics and Instrumentation but students still did not do well on the Physics and Instrumentation exam in capstone. She stated that students would like to continue the weekend course if Kim Crowley is ok with. Kim stated she is ok with meeting on the weekend for the boot camp. Students going to BSA, Covenant, and UMC will read with a physician. Dr. Cassuto talked about a case study and would like to continue that. Tamra is working on her self-study. She will be asking for information from the clinical sites. Will need 7 years of information. Tamra stated she hopes to be able to travel in the spring for a conference. We will be gathering items for the Downtown Women's Center in November and December. 1st and 2nd year students went to The Escape Room in October to help them with teamwork and leadership. Tamra stated she will be taking Popcorn Tins to Clinical sites in December. In spring working on an assignment with Radiography or Nursing students. BSA felt there is more interaction with Radiography but the others felt there was more interaction with nursing. Tamra stated she will talk to both Radiography and nursing for next semester. Will be asking for feedback. Tamra stated pass rates are good. Job placement is 100% for those who went into Nuclear Medicine. Nuclear Medicine will have a site visit in 2022. Tamra mentioned she is traveling to Lubbock on Nov. 8th for a student site evaluation. Tiffany Stevens – CT NWTXH – Tiffany stated the students have been great.
