The possible composition would be board faculty senate, academic leadership, advising, registrar's office, legal HR student affairs, enrollment management. Diversity in function and makeup of the committee is essential and should be limited to no more than 10 people. Terminology and scope should be considered and should be policy that will affect the classroom.

- Resources (external funding, proper allocation of institutional resources)
- Programs/Services Offered (is program ready for the future?)
- Other (Fire-fighting)

Members separated into groups to discuss topics and offered feedback.
