DISCUSSION:

1. STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER PROGRAMMING

Information Technology, Grants, Institutional Research, and Human Resources will remain on the second floor of the Student Service building. The third floor of the Ware Student Commons might become a centralized space for tutoring services. The Ware Library renovation is projected to be done in sections.

Amarillo College strives to align holiday breaks with the Amarillo Independent School District to avoid conflicts for employees with school-age kids. - · Non-Texas resident or International Student
- · Enrolled full-time (12 or more hours per term, Fall and Spring)

President's Transfer Scholarship

\$3,000/yr for up to 2 years

- · 3.5 GPA + 60 transfer credit hours
- · U.S. citizen
- · Enrolled full-time (12 or more hours per term, Fall and Spring)*

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

\$500 one time award in addition to any other eligible scholarships
