1. Completion	Witherspoon
Mr. Witherspoon provided data on the 2013-2014 first time in college cohort. The data showed that more black, Hispanic, and white students are obtaining degrees now than in 2013-2014. However, students of color dropped out of college during the middle of the covid pandemic. Discussion took place regarding why students left and how to get the students back into college. The college also saw a decrease in dual credit enrollment.

3. Summer Historic Enrollment	Austin
Mr. Austin reported that online sections drive almost all summer enrollment, with Washington Street Campus enrollments following a distant second. The idea of moving to one 8-week session is not off the table. Dr. Clunis and Mr. Austin will meet soon to identify areas of concern and bring their findings back to Cabinet.
