DISCUSSION:

1. IT SECURITY Hepler, Jones

Mr. Shane Hepler shared current issues with ransomware/malware causing issues at the college. The newest malware being released piggybacks off of companies' email systems and then sends emails out from the company. Large email providers are limiting companies on how many emails can go out at one time.

Mr. Hepler shared his plans to protect Amarillo College against viruses and other outside threats. Employees need to leave their computers on at night to allow the system to scan and update them. Additionally, Employees will not have access to the AC network if they are out of the country or on a cruise. The alternative supervisor will need to approve time sheets if the immediate supervisor is out of the country.

2. ATD DEV ED/CO-REQ DATA

Witherspoon

Mr. Witherspoon shared data on the Texas College Bridge. House Bill 5 requires all AISDs in Texas to establish an alternative course to allow students who have not passed their TSI placement by their senior year could take the alternative course. Amarillo Independent School District partnered with Amarillo College to create courses for high school students to take in place of the TSI. High School students were allowed to take alternative courses at no cost. Data showed students who went through the Texas College Bridge program continued to struggle in developmental courses. Amarillo College's goal is student success and full-time enrollment.

Three years of corequisite enrollment (FT/PT)

- Male students less likely to be FT
- Male students less likely to be successful
- Older students less likely to be FT
- Older students outperform younger students

- Self-pay students less likely to FT
- Transfer Program students more likely to be FT
- Part-time students are less likely to be successful than Full-time
