Ensure that the program has adequate resources and a well-designed curriculum to provide students with the knowledge, skills and abilities essential for their employment. Must be composed of persons who broadly represent the demographics, including ethnic and gender diversity of the institution's service area as well as the occupational field in all sectors of the business community within the institution's service area. Full time faculty & staff of the college may not be members of the advisory committee, but they may serve in an exofficio capacity. Advisory committees of existing programs must meet in person a minimum of one time a year and should have a quorum present. The State of Texas requires at least one meeting per year, but this first year we will conduct several meetings. Linda explained the goal for the fall semester as well as the academic year: Evaluating the goals and objectives of the program curriculum. Establishing workplace competencies for the program occupation(s). Suggesting program revisions as needed. Evaluating the adequacy of existing college facilities and equipment. Identifying local business and industry leaders who will provide students with external learning, experiences, employment and placement opportunities.
