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JBS BETTER FUTURES

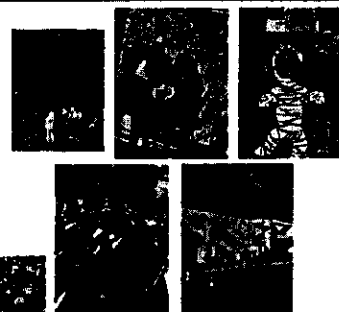


- **JBS: Better Futures Program (Began Fall 21)**

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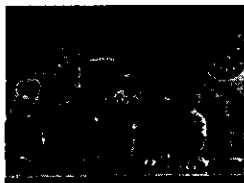
ACMCC- TECH PROGRAMS
