RNEC NURSING

- · RNEC Transition Class December 2022

- ALL graduates were employed by the Moore County Hospital District
- RNEC classes have full cohorts in 2023, 10 students in ADN and 11 in LVN
- Nursing students received a \$500 scholarship from the Moore County Health Foundation every semester. To date, MCHF has given over \$150,000 to students!
- We partner with the MCHD to provide Certified Nursing Assistant classes. As part of an EARN and LEARN program, CNA students work, attend the class and become employees of the MCHD.

TUTORING AND HESI PREP IN THE SUCCESS CENTER

- HESI Prep
 - · SP 2023- 26 students serviced
- Success Center is currently working with on campus staff to assist with HESI prep for the spring
- New furniture was placed in the center using funds from the AC Foundation Grant
- * Between Spring of 2022 and Spring of 2023, visits to the center have risen 47%

BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH STUDENTS

- Active Listening-Ask questions and listen-What is important to the student?-repeat back
- Connect everyday:



- *Calendar reminder each morning, try to find two things in common with each student during advising
- · Always at the end of an advising meeting ask: What other questions do you have?
- *Open ended questions whenever possible-get students to TALK
- · Always let a student know what I CAN do as an advisor in my role

*If they need support outside of the advising role, let the students know we will help find the right


