DISCUSSION:

1. GATEWAY COURSE OUTCOMES

Witherspoon

Mr. Witherspoon presented data on gateway course outcomes.

- Data for English and math classes reflects transfer courses only
 - Aspen requests data for FTIC students (Fall 2020 cohort), excluding students who
 previously took dual credit
 - Texas is also focusing on gateway and transfer completion for funding
 - Student success measures retention and credit accumulation

Cabinet discussed gateway courses.

- Low-sequence, high enrollment, low pass rate courses
- Achieving the Dream designated the original gateway courses
- Many of AC's original gateway courses now have high success rates and should no longer be defined as gateway
- A best practice is to get students enrolled in math and English courses during their first year
- AC's English and math completion increased 5% from 2017 to 2020.

AC's transfer rates will not increase the overall completion data as it is currently at 10%. COVID greatly affected enrollments.

Action Items:

2. GENERAL ASSEMBLY
