

School & Workplace Violence: Threat Assessment & Management

Friday, February 8, 2013 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Course Description

The workplace and school violence threat assessment class will teach law enforcement officials, school officials, and business administrators how to properly evaluate threats of violence. The Secret Service Threat Assessment in Schools model will be discussed along with the FBI Behavioral Science Unit School Shooter Threat Assessment protocol. Both threat assessments are appropriate for workplace violence and other threats as well as school violence. Termination procedures for high risk employees will be examined along with hiring procedures for identifying and excluding high-risk employment applicants. Classification and analysis of threat contents will be discussed. Case studies will be presented by the instructor, participants may provide their own examples, and participants will apply the concepts learned in classroom exercises.

Instructor Bio

Perry Gilmore is the Assistant Chief of Police for the Amarillo Police Department with 35 years of experience. He has a Ph.D. in psychology and extensive training in school and workplace violence prediction and prevention. His training includes seminars hosted at the headquarters for the FBI and Secret Service; he is a graduate of the FBI National Academy. His practical experience in threat assessment and management includes 22 years as the senior hostage negotiator for the Amarillo PD and extensive practical experience investigating and providing guidance in cases involving threats of violence in or to schools, businesses, government officials, and private individuals.
