Recent mailings of deadly ricin to public officials and the bombing of the Boston Marathon remind us, once again, of the need for early recognition of emerging radical, confrontational, and volatile groups which espouse hate, anger, and violence and threaten the safety of our communities. Events such as these illustrate why it is critical for law enforcement officers to enhance their ability to identify and gauge potential threats and increase their understanding of the mindset, motivations, ideologies, attitudes, and behaviors of such threats.

<u>The need is obvious</u>...from the "sleeper Jihadist," the lone wolf, the separatists, the sovereign citizen, vocal extremists, and confrontational anarchists to the less apparent, cloaked and potentially disastrous hidden threats that are only waiting for the right opportunity to ignite.

Ardently protective of the First Amendment, yet concerned with destructive, lawless behavior. Our one-day "intelligence sharing" seminar examines a number of domestic threats in keeping with the Department of Justice's efforts to fight "homegrown" terrorism. The seminar addresses the basics: who, what, where, when and how, by sharing the most recent information and experiences available. But unlike traditional police training experiences, attendees will be encouraged to actively engage in the exchange of "knowledge," comparing and contrasting experiences and sharing insights, best practices and lessons learned.

Raise awareness, and lower vulnerability. This seminar provides the tools that will help attendees foster recognition of characteristics in furtherance of the identification of potential threats. The seminar will further provide an enhanced understanding of the hidden faces that encourage discontent and violence as a means to justify their ideological crusades.
