Instructors

Scott Cantu was born and raised in Amarillo, Texas. Before graduating from Amarillo High School, he joined the U.S. Army through the Delayed Entry Program. Soon after graduating, he went to Fort Benning, GA. After completing his first army assignment, he was ordered to Fort Campbell, KY where he served with the 3/187 Infantry Regiment. While assigned to the 3/187, he went to Air Assault School, Ranger Induction Program, and S.O.T.I.C. Special Operations Identification Course. Soon after the events of 9/11, the unit was deployed to Afghanistan. While there he served with the RECON Unit and learned a lot about life. From Afghanistan, he was deployed to Iraq for the invasion. In Iraq, Scott served 9 months as a sniper before returning to the U.S. When he returned home to Amarillo, he was employed by the Potter County Sheriff's Office. After a year, he accepted employment at the Pantex nuclear weapons plant in Amarillo as a Security Police Officer. Scott worked for Pantex for 3 years before opening LS Hunting. With the advantages and resources of LS Hunting, Scott has continued in sport shooting. He later started the LS Shooting School and SpearHead Tactical. These ventures have been growing for over 5 years now.

Randy Glass was born and raised in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Prior to completing High School, Randy enlisted in the US Marine Corps and was added to the Delayed Entry Program. Upon graduation, he immediately attended Marine Boot Camp in Parris Island, S.C. and was soon a member of 1st Battalion 2nd Marines, 2d MarDiv, Camp Lejeune N.C. Over the next four years, he served with PSD Security Platoon, Marine Special Purpose FORCE Platoon, Scout/Sniper Platoon, and was a Marine Infantry Squad Leader in Iraq. He has attended a host of military and post-military specialized training, ranging from advanced survival schools to advanced/urban/counter sniper courses. He continues to compete in long range shooting and sniper-specific competitions. Randy is also a Nationally Certified EMT and is currently completing a degree in Biology from West Texas A&M University.

Course Information

This is specialized marksmanship training for the law enforcement officer interested in extended range target identification and engagements. We will develop an officer's ability to perform medium to complex tasks involving long range ballistics and increasing his or her knowledge surrounding the responsibilities of an individual or team of marksmen.

Target Population: Certified peace officers desiring basic knowledge and skilled proficiency in the topic area of long range target engagements beyond 500 yards. Government officers and U.S. military officers are also invited to attend.

Prerequisites: Basic marksmanship skills and the ability to employ a sniper rifle or designated marksman rifle, to include the operations of the rifle optic and related equipment.

Training Facility: Multimedia student classroom, multiple live fire ranges, specialized skills courses, target tracking and identification training areas.

Evaluation Procedures: Instructor-to-student interaction, oral and written participation, weapons qualifications, written evaluations, skills testing.
