The workshop also outlines how agencies improve their intelligence capacity and emphasizes privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties.

The **Criminal Elements of the Sovereign Citizen Movement Workshop** addresses the beliefs of sovereign citizens and the threats presented by the criminal extremist element of the movement. The workshop focuses on frauds employed by sovereign citizens and indicators that enable law enforcement officers to recognize sovereign citizens and assess the level of threat.
