Self-Aid/Buddy-Aid for Patrol Officers



Monday – Wednesday January 25-27, 2016 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. (24 hours of TCOLE Credit Provided)

This 3-day training course focuses on providing patrol officers with the skills and knowledge to mentally and physically survive a traumatic injury. Law enforcement officers work in hazardous conditions every day. Work-related injuries vary from twisted ankles during foot chases, to lacerations from violent physical confrontations with offenders, to serious traumatic injuries received from vehicle crashes, edged weapons, or gunshots. Emergency medical services may not always be readily available or may not have timely access to you when you are injured. Being able to identify various types of injuries and knowing how to administer emergency self-aid may keep you alive until you can receive advanced medical care. Ultimately, surviving a serious injury before help arrives may be up to you! What will you do to stay alive?

Each officer will be provided with a new Individual First Aid Kit (IFAK) to be used during classroom instruction and to take away from the class with them (~\$125 retail value). The slim-design IFAK contains the essential basic life support equipment needed for self-aid/buddy-aid.

Every student will receive an IFAK Kit as part of the course (~\$125 retail value).

For courses of more than 20 hours, there will be a \$20 charge. These costs are billed by and payable to PRPC from the officer's agency.
