Dear Dr. Matney:

Thank you for your letter and documentation dated June 20, 2013, provided in response to the Commission on Colleges' letter dated February 26, 2013, which requested faculty credential information related to the prospectus submitted by Amarillo College on March 12, 2013.

The Commission on Colleges' letter of February 26, 2013, stated that action regarding Amarillo College's prospectus request for approval to offer 50% or more of program credits at multiple high school dual-enrollment off-campus instructional sites was deferred pending receipt of faculty credential information.

Amarillo College's request for approval to offer greater than 50% of program credits included the following off-campus high school dual-enrollment instructional sites, identified in the following table – organized according to the original prospectus attachments:

Faculty credential information (accompanied by Amarillo College's <u>Faculty Credentials and Qualifications Manual)</u> organized according to the prospectus attachments, documents that all faculty members are qualified to teach assigned courses. Note that one (1) faculty assigned to teach a U.S. Government (GOVT 2305) course presented questionable credentials. Per email confirmation from Amarillo College's Institutional Liaison to Dr. Tanya Gorman on October 2, 2013, this faculty member has been removed from teaching this course.

The Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges reviewed the materials seeking approval of Amarillo College's identified high school off-campus instructional sites to offer greater than 50% of program credits. It was the decision of the Board to approve these sites and include them in the scope of the institution's current accreditation.

The approval of an off-campus instructional site is effective for a maximum of five years. The site will be reviewed, which may include a site visit, as part of the institution's fifth-year or decennial review.

Please note that effective January 1, 2013, once an off-campus instructional site is approved, no notification is necessary when adding any approved program to the site.
